

**Alexander Uskov, CS/IS IT specialist, Adam Byerly, an undergraduate computer science major, and Dr. Vladimir Uskov, professor of Computer Science and Information Systems, are recipients of the “2008 Best Non-Commercial Software System for Web-Based Education” award.**

The prestigious Annual international competition of software development teams in the area of Web-Based Education has been organized by multiple professional associations and organizations; the final session of the competition took place in the Congress Center, Innsbruck, Austria on March 17-18, 2008.

Twenty two independent international judges from 18 countries evaluated presented innovative systems and products in the area of Web-Based Education. Representatives of 30+ countries around the world participated in this professional event.

The developed software system – All-in-One Educational Content Creator for Web-Based Education - enables users from various geographic locations to create structure, manage and immediately post on the Web rich multimedia teaching materials and learning modules that comprise of video, audio, data, text, graphics, animation, augmented narration, and other types of media.

This research project is partially supported by the obtained National Science Foundation ITWF grant and Caterpillar Fellowship grant.






